

SLIDE 1

Welcome to Supplier Performance Risk System, SPRS, Updates to Solicitation Tutorial. This tutorial will provide information on the changes to the look and feel in the SPRS Solicitation Modules.

SLIDE 2

The first solicitation area updated is the Solicitation Inquiry Module which can be accessed by going to Solicitation Inquiry from the Performance Reports section on the menu.

SLIDE 3

Changes include: only one (1) Supply Code can be added per Solicitation Assessment,

SLIDE 4

only five (5) CAGE(s) can be added per Solicitation Assessment,

SLIDE 5

And the Max Bid has been Increased to \$999,999,999.99.

Lastly, in Best Value Assessment, there is an addition of a static display of Cost percentage (%), Delivery percentage (%), and Quality percentage (%) as chosen and entered by the Contracting Officer.

SLIDE 6

The next solicitation area that has been updated is the Edit Existing Solicitation and Solicitation History, which can be accessed by going to the Edit Existing Solicitation or Solicitation History from the Performance Reports section on the menu.

SLIDE 7

Both modules show, if a user is recalling a previously saved assessment that contains a CAGE that is now Excluded, the CAGE will turn red and there will be an indicator stating that the CAGE is excluded.
